(Dissolution of Temporary Stay of Execution Imposed by Executive Order 02-262)

WHEREAS, on September 25, 2002, the Governor was informed that Aileen Wuornos, who is an inmate at Florida State Prison, under sentence of death, may not be competent to be executed, and

WHEREAS, Section 922.07, Florida Statutes, required a temporary stay of execution upon the receipt of such notice, and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of Section 922.07, Florida

Statutes, Executive Order 02-262 was entered imposing a temporary stay of execution and appointing three competent, disinterested psychiatrists (the Commission) to examine the mental condition of Aileen Wuornos, and

WHEREAS, the Commission has completed its examination of Aileen Wuornos, and based upon its report to the Governor, the Governor finds that Aileen Wuornos has the mental capacity to understand the nature of the death penalty and the reasons why it was imposed upon her, and

WHEREAS, there is no reason for a continued stay of the execution of Aileen Wuornos;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JEB BUSH, as Governor of the State of Florida, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and the Laws of the State of Florida, do hereby promulgate the following Executive Order:

2. The death warrant for Aileen Wuornos, signed on September 5, 2002, and under which her execution was scheduled for October 9, 2002 at 9:30 a.m., remains in full force and effect.

Dear General Butterworth:

As you are aware, a temporary stay of the execution of Aileen Wuomos was entered on September 30, 2002, after I was informed that Ms. Wuomos's attorney had grave doubts about her competency to be executed.

Pursuant to Executive Order 02-262, the stay of execution was entered and a commission of three psychiatrists was appointed to examine Ms. Wuomos and report on whether she understands the nature and effect of the death penalty and why it is to be imposed on her. The Commission examined Ms. Wuomos on October 1, 2002, and advised me in writing that Aileen Wuomos has "no major psychiatric illness and understands the nature and effect of the death penalty and why it is being imposed upon her." Therefore, she is competent to be executed.

Pursuant to Section 922.07, Florida Statutes, I have entered an Executive Order lifting the stay of execution of Ailcen Wuomos effective immediately. Further, the date and time of execution for Ms. Wuomos shall remain October 9, 2002 at 9:30 a.m.
